The Chesapeake region's settlements have grown slowly due to diseases such as malaria. Most of these settlers were male immigrants from England who died shortly after their arrival. It should be noted, however, that from the outset the two nations were unique and had their own unique identity. The differences between the two peoples actually illustrate the main reason why England decided to colonize them at the time. It is important to note that New England had interests in terms of land use, which is mostly different from Chesapeake. In terms of Chesapeake, the main interest was mainly in the large coverage of the land, which included Rhode Island, Plymouth, Massachusetts Bay Colony, New Haven and Connecticut.
